## TAMWORTH CITY TOUR

**Suggested Tour Time: approx. 8 hours**

### **Tamworth Regional Botanic Gardens**

*Top end of Piper Street, Tamworth*

The botanic gardens were designed to display and conserve the flora of the region. The gardens are a means of showing the public the range of plants that may be grown in gardens and public places, whilst also making an idyllic picnic location.

### **Miniature Railway**

*Top end of Piper Street, Tamworth (adjacent to the botanic gardens)*

The miniature railway comprises of circuits and sidings with a station, steaming bays, tunnels and a signal box. It is fun for the whole family, with children enjoying riding the trains.

### **Weswal Gallery**

*Top end of Brisbane Street, Tamworth*

Weswal Gallery brings the works of emerging to established contemporary Australian artists to the region. Unique handmade jewellery, glass ware, fine woodwork, accessories and a range of distinctive giftwares are available from the gallery shop.



### **Anzac Park and Liberty Swing**

*Cnr Fitzroy & Napier Streets, Tamworth*

Anzac park boast its wonderful play equipment for children, which includes a flying fox, swings, slide etc. At the park there is a specifically designed swing for people with disabilities – liberty Swing.

### **Tamworth Regional Craft Centre**

*Peel Street, Tamworth*

The craft centre specialises in all creative craft from painting to quilting, embroidery, woodturning, even blacksmithing and bonsai. All forms of creative craft are on display and for sale.

### **Tamworth Powerstation Museum**

*Peel Street, Tamworth*

First Municipal Electric Street lighting in Australia commenced in Tamworth. The museum features displays of the history of electricity and items reflecting the impact of the development of electricity on modern society.

### **Calala Cottage**

*Denison Street, Tamworth*

The cottage is run by the Tamworth Historical Society. Visitors can get a guided tour of the cottage by society members and experience many aspects of the districts historical past.

### **Tamworth Regional Entertainment Conference Centre**

*Greg Norman Drive, Tamworth*

TRECC is capable of hosting some of the largest events in Australia under one roof. TRECC plays host to the red carpet Golden Guitar Awards – the Oscars of country music – for 5000 fans every year.

### **Australian Equine & Livestock Events Centre – AELEC**

*New England Highway, Tamworth*

AELEC is a rural events venue built for the purpose of providing established national events with a world class facility. This is an amazing venue, one place not to be missed.

### **Powerhouse Motorcycle Museum**

*Marius Street, Tamworth*

Rev up your day with a visit to the Powerhouse Motorcycle Museum, where there are more than 50 motorcycles on show, some dating back to the 1950's through to the 1980's.

### **Tamworth Regional Art Gallery**

*Peel Street, Tamworth*

The gallery features two exhibition galleries, gallery shop, research library and impressive exhibitions that change every six weeks.

### **Bicentennial Park/ Whaler Horse**

*Kable Avenue, Tamworth*

The beautiful Bicentennial Park stretches along the banks of the Peel River including ponds with ducks, water features and stone artwork. The park also houses the Waler Memorial. The bronze sculpture is a tribute to those men of the Anzac corps who served in the Boer, Sudan and First World Wars.

### **Oxley Lookout**

*Top end of White Street*

The Lookout is minutes from the CBD and it offers exceptional views of the city and the Peel River Plain extending to the Liverpool Ranges.
