

FREE ACTIVITIES AROUND TAMWORTH

BOTANIC GARDENS

Top end of Piper Street, Victoria Park and Oxley Park, Tamworth

Open: 7 days, 8am – 4:30pm

Free admission

Suggested visit time: 1 hour

The Botanic Gardens were officially opened in 2001 and are designed to display and conserve the flora of the region. It is a means of showing the public and landscapers the range of plants that may be grown in gardens and public places, whilst also making an idyllic picnic location.

ENDEAVOUR MARSUPIAL PARK

Top End Brisbane Street, Tamworth

Suggested visit time: 1 hour

The Marsupial Park is within the confines of the Oxley Park and is on 28 hectares of natural habitat for native animals and birds. You'll be lucky enough to see kangaroos, possums, echidnas, emus and free roaming birds whilst you explore the park. The park has toilet and barbecue facilities and a picnic shelter.

OXLEY LOOKOUT

Top end of White Street, Tamworth

Suggested visit time: 15 minutes

This lookout offers a superb landmark to view the entire city and sits 519 metres above sea level. A great starting point to your journey around the Tamworth region as you get a panoramic view of the city with fantastic photographic opportunities.

KAMILAROI WALKING TRACK

Top end of White Street, Tamworth

Suggested visit time: 3 hours

The Kamilaroi Walking Track is located in Oxley Park, behind the Oxley Lookout and has a range of walks over varied distances and terrain. The total length of the track is 6 km, which can be comfortably completed in three hours. The full journey to Flagstaff Mountain is very rewarding and along the track you will witness native flora, fauna and animals.

PEEL RIVER WALK/ CYCLEWAY

The Peel River walk is an easy 2.6 km stroll along a paved footpath that follows the Peel River through Bicentennial Park and the CBD. The river presents a tranquil atmosphere to either stretch the legs or cycle through the heart of the city.

Tamworth regional gallery is one of the oldest regional galleries in NSW. Established in 1919, the gallery features two exhibition galleries, gallery shop, public meeting room, research library and impressive exhibitions that change every six weeks. It has hosted some of the most prestigious touring exhibitions in Australia.

HERITAGE WALK

Various streets and buildings around Tamworth

The Heritage Walk is listed on the back of the free local Tamworth map from the Visitor Information Centre. Take in a walk through the city, the total distance of 4.7 km's will take you past many historic buildings within Tamworth including churches, theatres and hotels. Be sure to take your camera!

HERITAGE DRIVE

Various streets and buildings around Tamworth

The Heritage Drive is listed on the back of the free local Tamworth map from the Visitor Information Centre. Cruise past historic monuments and buildings that will give you a lasting impression of the original Tamworth.



BICENTENNIAL PARK / WALER LIGHT HORSE STATUE

The Waler Horse statue is located at the southern end of beautiful Bicentennial Park, across the pond from the World War II Memorial and the Man-O-War iron gates. The bronze sculpture is a tribute and memorial to those men of the ANZAC corps who served in the Boer, Sudan and First World Wars. Bicentennial Park was established to commemorate the bicentenary in 1988 and provides passive recreation, pathways, fountains, sculptures and Tamworth's fascinating history recorded in granite.

ANZAC PARK

ANZAC Park was once a favoured area for aboriginal corroborees, now the picturesque parkland has a skate bowl, children's fort, flying fox and other play equipment, barbecues, picnic facilities and toilet blocks. The park also has facilities for visitors with a disability including a liberty swing (the key for the liberty swing can be collected at the Tamworth Visitor Information Centre). A feature of Anzac Park includes the Sandakin Memorial.
